
- Create an inclusive space for M&I trainees

### 'Tis the Time to be Inclusive

- Not everyone celebrates Christmas
- Some may celebrate other holidays
- Some may not have any celebrations during this time
  - Your lab member/colleague may not understand Christmas tradition references
- Even for those celebrating a holiday this time, not everyone may be going home



## Inclusive practices around holidays

- Greetings:
  - o ex) "happy holidays" instead of "Merry Xmas"
- Conscious of holiday party decorations:
  - Less emphasis on one type of celebration
- Keep diverse options for food and drink items
  - Good practice to ask for dietary restrictions/accommodations
- Be understanding if someone withdraws themselves from a celebratory event
- Be open to learning about other cultural, religious, or family holiday traditions

### Practices that are not so inclusive

- Assuming what others celebrate
- Overemphasis of one type of holiday
- Force anyone to conform to your traditions
  - Decorating
  - Gift-giving
  - Party attendance
- Assume that everyone spends this time with family during December break



# Making Changes this Holiday

- Learn about the holidays that are special to your colleagues!
- Make an effort to include the different holidays celebrated by your lab members/colleagues throughout the year
- Try creating a lab calendar with all of the holidays that your labmates celebrate!



# Other December Holidays

Kwanzaa Dec. 26 to Jan. 1

- Celebrated by the African diaspora.
- Activities around this time may include: feasts, music, dancing, poetry, narratives, and ending with reflection on the "seven principles".

### Hanukkah Dec. 18-26

- The Jewish festival of lights, lasting 8-days.
- Activities around this time include: lighting a candle of the menorah each day, as well as food and song and gift giving for 8-days.
