Sessional Lecturer Position

The University of British Columbia invites applications for a Sessional Lecturer position in the Department of Microbiology & Immunology on the Vancouver campus. This is a 4-month position that will start September 1, 2025 and end on December 31, 2025.

The successful applicant will be assigned to teach the MICB 305 Data Science in Microbiology and Immunology Research course in term 1 of the 2025 winter session.

A team-based data science research experience in microbiology and immunology. MICB 305 is a hybrid course with a blend of online modules and in-person tutorials. Students learn command line and R to work with amplicon sequencing data then pursue a novel research project on a dataset of their choice. The lectures are scheduled for Tuesdays and Thursdays, 8:00 – 9:00 am (in IRC 1 for term 1, IRC 4 for term 2).

The sessional lecturer will adapt course content, provide in person instruction and assess student learning through assignments and exams. Working under the direction of the course coordinator, the sessional lecturer will teach up to 36 hours of in-person lectures. The successful candidate will be mentored by a faculty member in the teaching stream.

The minimum qualification is an MSc or candidacy in a PhD program in microbiology, immunology, or a related field. Applicants are required to have demonstrated excellence in teaching, as well as proven ability to contribute to curriculum development, course design and other initiatives that advance the University's ability to excel in its teaching and learning mandate. This successful applicant will be supported by, and encouraged to contribute to the department's commitment to innovative evidence-based teaching and learning approaches.

The compensation rate per credit per period for the Department of Microbiology & Immunology starts at \$11,600 per 3-credit course.

Candidates are encouraged to submit their application, which should include a Curriculum Vitae, names and e-mail addresses of three referees, a statement of teaching philosophy and interests, evidence of content area expertise and teaching effectiveness, and experience with emerging technologies in teaching and learning. Candidates are particularly encouraged to highlight previous experience in fostering the education of students from diverse backgrounds.
