

## Sessional Lecturer Position

The University of British Columbia invites applications for a Sessional Lecturer position in the Department of Microbiology & Immunology on the Vancouver campus. This is a 4-month position that will start January 1, 2026 and end on April 30, 2026.

The successful applicant will be assigned to teach the **MICB 353 Food Microbiology Laboratory** (1 credit) in term 2 of the 2025 Winter session.

### **MICB 353 Food Microbiology Laboratory**

The sessional lecturer will adapt course content, provide in person instruction and assess student learning through assignments and exams. The sessional lecturer will teach and supervise in-person laboratory sessions (2 hours each, once per week) for up to 28 students per section with a teaching assistant. The instructor will deliver up to 10 laboratory sessions over the term. The sessional lecturer will demonstrate laboratory techniques and assess student laboratory competencies. The sessional lecturer will ensure teaching assistant and student compliance with laboratory safety requirements. The instructor will also deliver in-person lectures (1 hours each, once per week) throughout the term. The lectures are scheduled for Mondays, 2:00 – 3:00 pm (the room location to be determined). The laboratory session is scheduled for Mondays from 3:00 – 5:00 pm in BIOL 3145.

The compensation rate per credit per period for the Department of Microbiology & Immunology starts at \$11,600 per 3-credit course.

The minimum qualification is an MSc or candidacy in a PhD program in microbiology, immunology, or a related field. Applicants are required to have demonstrated excellence in teaching, as well as proven ability to contribute to curriculum development, course design and other initiatives that advance the University's ability to excel in its teaching and learning mandate. Applicants are required to have expertise in tissue culture and associated sterile techniques, and demonstrated excellence in teaching and safe laboratory operation. This successful applicant will be supported by, and encouraged to contribute to the department's commitment to innovative evidence-based teaching and learning approaches.

Candidates are encouraged to submit their application, which should include a Curriculum Vitae, names and e-mail addresses of three referees, a statement of teaching philosophy and interests, evidence of content area expertise and teaching effectiveness, and experience with emerging technologies in teaching and learning. Candidates are particularly encouraged to highlight previous experience in fostering the education of students from diverse backgrounds.
