

## Sessional Lecturer Position

The University of British Columbia invites applications for a Sessional Lecturer position in the Department of Microbiology & Immunology on the Vancouver campus. This is a part time position in the **MICB 323 Molecular Immunology and Virology Laboratory** course in term 2 of the 2024 Summer Session that will start June 15, 2024 and end on August 30, 2024.

Teaching duties will be serving as the instructor for laboratory sessions in the MICB 323 course. Working under the direction of the course coordinator, the instructor will teach and supervise in-person laboratory sessions (4 hours each, twice per week) for up to 28 students with a teaching assistant. The instructor will deliver up to 12 laboratory sessions over the term. The instructor will demonstrate laboratory techniques and assess student laboratory competencies. The instructor will ensure teaching assistant and student compliance with laboratory safety requirements. The instructor will also deliver in-person lectures (2 hours each, once per week) throughout the term.

The minimum qualifications are (1) is an MSc or candidacy in a PhD program in immunology or a related field and (2) expertise in tissue culture and associated sterile techniques. Applicants are required to have demonstrated excellence in teaching, safe laboratory operation, and other initiatives that advance the University's ability to excel in its teaching and learning mandate. This successful applicant will be supported by, and encouraged to contribute to the department's commitment to innovative evidence-based teaching and learning approaches.

The compensation rate per credit per period for the Department of Microbiology & Immunology starts at \$3866.67 equaling \$11,600 per 3-credit course.

Candidates are encouraged to submit their application, which should include a Curriculum Vitae, names and e-mail addresses of three referees, a statement of teaching philosophy and interests, evidence of content area expertise and teaching effectiveness, and experience with emerging technologies in teaching and learning. Candidates are particularly encouraged to highlight previous experience in fostering the education of students from diverse backgrounds.
